South led the ♥J and having won with dummy's king declarer cashed the ♠A, North pitching the ♥5. Declarer continued with the ♣2 and when North followed with the six he went up with the king (an essential move). When it held, he pitched a club on the ace of hearts. Despite the appearance of the jack declarer continued with the ♥Q and South ruffed with the ♠7. Declarer could overruff but was now locked in dummy. He tried a club and North went up with the ace (playing low to allow South to win and cash the top spades will result in one down) and exited with a diamond. Declarer took South's king with the ace, cashed the queen and crossruffed his way to 10 tricks, +420.

If declarer resists the temptation to cash the ♥Q

and plays on diamonds he will secure his contract.

North led the ♥10 and declarer won with the king, cashed the ♦A and followed it with the four, North winning with the jack and returning the ♥6 to dummy's queen. Here too declarer attempted to cash another heart (only running the ♠10 works now) and South ruffed. Declarer overruffed with the ♠Q, ruffed a diamond and played the ♠9 for the jack and ace. A club to dummy's jack saw South win and force dummy with the ♦K. That meant South had two trump winners and the ♣A added up to two down, -100 and 11 IMPs for Sweden.

Only one pair stopped short of game – but 4♠ was made only 12 times.

West led the ♣3 and East took the king and ace and switched to the ♥10. Declarer took the ace and played a spade to the ten. When that held he continued with a spade and East won with the king, cashed the ♦K and exited with a diamond. West won, cashed the ♥K and played another heart for East to ruff. The ♠A meant the contract was six down, -1400.

South led the ♠3 and declarer won with the ace and played a diamond for the three, seven and queen. When North returned the ♠10 declarer finished with 12 tricks by virtue of scoring the ♠8 at trick 13. However, +690 meant the loss of another 12 IMPs.

Three pairs bid 6♣ and found they had reached a 'good slam' in accordance with Hamman's dictum.

continued with the ♦A followed by the five. Declarer ruffed, cashed the ♠A and when South dropped the queen followed it with the ♣7. South went up with the ace and exited with the ♦K and declarer was soon claiming for one down, -100.

The early play was identical to that in the other room, but here after ruffing the second diamond declarer played his club immediately. When South followed with the ♣2 declarer had a tenth trick, +620 and 12 IMPs.

Four pairs made 4♠. At two tables North doubled. At one South's pass netted -200 and 3 IMPs but at the other South tried 4NT and the subsequent 5♦ cost -800 and 14 IMPs.

North led the ♠9 and when he was allowed to win

with the queen declarer unblocked the clubs, went to dummy with a heart and cashed three more clubs. By the time he advanced the ♦J South was down to the bare queen, so +720 but a 13 IMP loss.

Four pairs bid a slam.

In my featured match Sweden won 25-16 which translated to 13.14-6.86 and Sweden's total for the day of 33.14 was enough to take them to the top of the table.

## Champions' Summit

### Marek Wójcicki

Round 1., table 1. The two highest seeded teams of our tournament started the battle. Poland against Lithuania. The players of both teams have been good friends for many years. Among them, there are seven current world champions from World Bridge Series Wrocław 2022. To add some spice – five of them played there on the same team. Vitas Vainikonis, Wojtek Olański, Apolinary Kowalski (Lithuania at TSC 2023), Michał Kwiecień and Włodek Starkowski (Poland I at TSC 2023) won Rand Cup (Senior Transnational Teams World Championships).

Second pair of Poland I – Piotr Bizoń and Marek Blat won World Seniors Pairs Championships. And last, but not least, the eighth player of the match – Jerzy Russyan – has in his collection of seniors titles „only” silver from World Championships, but 3 European gold medals – two in teams (2001,2010) and one in pairs (2011). Take into account as well that Lithuania team won Julian Klukowski Memorial Trophy in 2022.

Looking at such a line-up, we could expect high level of play. And it was. Let's look at two boards, both of them shown in Bulletin of yesterday, as they created serious problems.:

The first step to win the board was to double, but it was also necessary to make the next one - to set it.

Who should provide a better defence than the world seniors matchpoints champions?

Blat led ♦4 and declarer won in hand. Jack of spades was won by the queen and East tried a club. Declarer won and played a ♥Q, won by the king. As the club count signal was completed at that trick, East continued with ♦J. Declarer won with the ace and continued a trump. East won and did not err - he played a spade, cutting communication necessary for the squeeze.

One down, 200 for East/West.

East players opened with the spade preempt (3♠ or 4♠) and at many tables bidding stopped at 4♠ doubled or 4♥. Very good heart slam was reached at only 7 tables out of 28. In our match the swing was 1 imp:

Starkowski took a rather optimistic view when he raised 5♥ to a slam, but this time Kwiecień bid a very sound 4NT (green vs red!). It took some time for Michał to bid after 6♥, but surprisingly (one of his nicknames is „a great slam hunter”) he finally chose a green card.

After spade lead, declarer ruffed, cashed trumps in two rounds, played ace of clubs and finessed club queen for an overtrick.

East started with his diamond singleton. Declarer won in hand with the ace, played a heart to the ace, club to the king and another heart. After that, club towards the jack, and the contract was made. 1 imp loss at the match, but +10 imps in Butler.

Finally, Poland I won the match 18-11 which translated to 12.51-7.49 VP.
