West led the ♥10 for the jack and queen and East continued with the ace and queen of spades, West overtaking with the king and switching to the ♦3. East won with the king and returned the six, declarer taking the ace and playing three rounds of clubs (better to leave trumps alone and exit with a spade). East took the third round (leaving West on lead is best) drew the outstanding trump and took two spades, but then had to lead into the heart tenace, three down, -800.

As is often the case when the opponents are out-gunned initial trump lead or an early switch by West should deliver an extra undertrick.

As it happens, 2♥ is a much better spot for NS. Ruth Nikitine and Peter Schurter (for Swiss Cheese) were the only pair to play there.

West led the ♠10 and having won with dummy's queen declarer unblocked the king and played two rounds of diamonds, East winning and switching to the ♣K. Declarer won with dummy's ace as West discarded the ♠3 and pitched a club on the ♦Q, West ruffing and exiting with the ♠J, ruffed and overruffed by East who continued with three rounds of clubs. When declarer ruffed with the ♥K West overruffed and exited with a heart, three down, -500.

As the cards lie, playing dummy's ♥Q at trick two and only then playing on diamonds should see declarer come to eight tricks.

It came up once, in the World Pairs Championship in Albuquerque when one of our opponents was a certain Eric Rodwell. Naturally I forgot and passed, turning a potential top into yet another bottom.

East led the ♣K and declarer won with the ace and played the ♦Q, West winning and continuing with the ♣J followed by the ♥3. Declarer won perforce, cashed the ♦K and was four down, -400.

A fair number opened 4♥ (as opposed to 3♥). If you accept that an off-shape double is too risky you will either pass or venture 4♠.

What North should do over South's double is open to question. I suspect the majority vote would be for 5♥. That leads to this table:

In the other room East's 4♥ had been passed out for -150.

West led the ♦A and declarer ruffed, cashed the ♠A and could then draw trumps ending in dummy via the finesse. Then cashing the ♥A and playing three rounds of diamonds put East in trouble. He pitched a heart, so declarer could cash three heart for all the tricks, but a club would have been no better. Declarer ruffs a diamond and cashed the ♠Q forcing East down to one club. Then the ♥KQ squeeze West in the minors for all the tricks.

Only a club lead will defeat 6♠. For example on a heart lead to dummy's ace, declarer plays a spade for the king and ace and can then play a spade to the nine followed by the ♦K, pitching a club. If West returns a trump the non-simultaneous double squeeze will lead to 12 tricks, while exiting with a club will allow declarer to ruff a loser in dummy.

Three pairs failed to reach game, South starting with a double and then seeing partner pass a rebid of 2♥/3♥.

I have only included the deal because first of all there is no defence to 7♦(!) and there is a neat point if the final contract is 6♥ and West leads a club. Declarer wins, and appreciating that East needs to hold ♥Kx plays a diamond, intending to put in dummy's ten. West must be alert and put in the jack!

Wouldn't that be something!
