5♥ doubled had to go two down, -300 and a 6 IMP start for the Canadians.

4♠ can be defeated, but only if East starts with an unlikely diamond, West winning and then underleading the ♥A so that East can play a second diamond. It only requires for East no more than to unblock the club king.

At this vulnerability it is not uncommon for West to be manoeuvring, hence North's decision to get involved.

East led the ♣A and when West followed with the ♣Q he continued with the king, declarer ruffing and playing a spade. West won with the jack and played two more rounds of the suit, declarer discarding a diamond. He ruffed the club continuation and exited with a heart to dummy's jack, West winning with the king and returning a heart. Two rounds of trumps were followed by the ♦Q and declarer scored two more diamonds at the end to 'escape' (if that is the right expression) for four down, -1100.

I suspect you can see how the defenders might have collected another trick (switch to a spade at trick two, West playing three rounds of the suit).

North led the $\diamond 4$ and when dummy's $\diamond 9$ held declarer cashed six clubs, finishing with an overtrick, +430 but a 12 IMP loss.

On Board 6 Tony Sowter overcalled South's $1\diamond$ with $2\clubsuit$ on

\spadesuit K \heartsuit A8 \diamond KQ105 \clubsuit A109765

and North doubled with

\spadesuit A1053 \heartsuit Q109763 \diamond 6 \clubsuit 43.

Looking at \spadesuit QJ96 \heartsuit 5 \diamond A742 \clubsuit KQJ2 South elected to pass. North led his diamond, but declarer dropped the $\diamond Q$ under the ace and when South switched to the $\spadesuit Q$ the chance of defeating the contract had gone, +180 being added to +110 for $2\spadesuit$ in the other room where South bid that over North's double.

South led the $\heartsuit 10$ for the queen and ace and North returned the $\heartsuit 2$ to dummy's jack. Declarer played three rounds of spades, won the heart return with the king and played a club, claiming when South won and switched to a diamond, +430 and 12 IMPs, taking the match score to 20-20.

On Board 9 the English team had an accident in the Open Room. With

\spadesuit A95 \heartsuit K9 \diamond Q953 \clubsuit K1082 opposite

\spadesuit KQ104 \heartsuit 83 \diamond AKJ876 \clubsuit 6

they bid $1\diamond$ -(Pass)- $1\spadesuit$ -(Dble)- $2\spadesuit$ -(Pass)- $3\diamond$ -All Pass. In an uncontested auction $3\diamond$ would be forcing but clearly North thought West's double changed things.

The Canadians sailed into 3NT via a relay sequence after North had opened a 10-13 INT and then shown a 3-2-4-4 shape, +430 being worth 7 IMPs.

West led the $\heartsuit 6$ and having taken dummy's ace declarer ran the $\diamond 8$ to West's queen. After various adventures declarer merged with no less than 10 tricks, which for a Burn's Law transgression at the five-level might be considered a minor triumph.

I suspect South wishes he had bid 4NT, promising two places to play.
